<i>Group of disorders(n)</i>	<i>Diagnosis by Expert Groups(Reasons for misdiagnosis)</i>
Single seizure (2)	Single focal seizure, Normal development, unknown cause
Pseudo seizures (1)	Pseudo seizures, No epilepsy (Remark: Multiple episodes of eye lid flickering with retained consciousness misinterpreted as seizures).
Other NDDs (3)	Perinatal asphyxia, Global developmental delay, Cerebral palsy, No epilepsy
Non-epileptic paroxysmal events (2)	Migraine variant (1) (Remark: Symptoms of migraine misinterpreted as multiple episodes of seizures) Communication disorder, physiological hypnic jerks (1) (Remark: Nocturnal physiological jerky movements misinterpreted as seizures).
Febrile seizures (2)	Simple febrile seizures, normal development
No NDD (3)	Reasons unclear
Seizure with measles	Reasons unclear

<i>Group of disorders(n)</i>	<i>Diagnosis by Expert Groups(Reasons for misdiagnosis)</i>
Acute symptomatic (Post traumatic seizures) (3)	Intellectual disability, hemiparesis, hyperactivity, epilepsy. (Remark: Undue importance given to trivial, incidental trauma and seizures attributed to head trauma).
Neuro cysticercosis (3)	Calcified granuloma (Neurocysticercosis), symptomatic epilepsy. (Remark: Seizures attributed to “brain infection” and misinterpreted as acute symptomatic seizures).
Neuro infections (Sequelae versus acute infection) (5)	Post encephalitic sequelae, epilepsy (1)* Neonatal-onset myoclonic epilepsy (1)* Perinatal asphyxia, cerebral palsy, epilepsy (1)* Cerebral palsy, epilepsy (1)* Generalized epilepsy, learning disorder, Otomastoiditis (1)* (*Remark: Seizures attributed to “brain infection” and misinterpreted as acute symptomatic seizures).
Febrile seizures (6)	Cerebral palsy, Global developmental delay, epilepsy (2)** Cerebral palsy, epilepsy (1)** Autistic disorder, epilepsy (1)** Autistic disorder, hyperactivity, epilepsy (1)** (**Remark: Seizures without fever in association with other neuro-developmental disabilities misinterpreted as febrile seizures).
Missed seizures (4)	Generalized epilepsy (1) A febrile seizures misrepresented as febrile seizures. Idiopathic epilepsy (3) Infantile spasms (1) (Remark: No obvious reason).
Single seizure (3)	Global developmental delay, epilepsy (2) Focal epilepsy (1) (Remark: Multiple seizures wrongly written as single seizure).
Systemic illness (1)	Tubercular adenitis, posterior reversible leukoencephalopathy, epilepsy. (Remark: Seizures misinterpreted as occurring during “systemic illness” and diagnosed as acute symptomatic seizures).
Partial epilepsy (2)	Reasons unclear
Infantile spasms (3)	Reasons unclear
Post encephalitic sequelae (1)	Reasons unclear
Cerebral palsy/other NDD (3)	Reasons unclear
